However, we suggest you or your guests utilize the on-street parking options for any quick trips and then utilize the surface lots for longer visits. 

Willis Park-a.k.a. The Square

Willis Park is the heart of downtown and is lined with boutiques and antique shops. It is a charming garden style park complete with a Victorian gazebo and fountain. Willis Park is home to many holiday activities including Holiday Open House, Yuletide Jubilee and Christmas Eve in the park. Throughout the year, many members of the community gather for various forms of entertainment.



Chason Park + Riverwalk

The J.D. Chason Memorial Park is a historic location and is where DeSoto and his men crossed the Flint River over three centuries ago. The El Camino Real, the King's Highway, also crossed the grounds. Located within the Park is a splash pad, playground and riverwalk.

Hook & Ladder + Playground-220 N Broad Street

Heavily altered over time, the vacant property at the intersection of Broad Street and Market Street housed the livery stable of the Hook & Ladder Fire Brigade at the turn of the century. Rather than tearing down an historic building and adding another vacant lot to N Broad Street, creating an open-air venue preserves a piece of Bainbridge's heritage while inviting public use and

Open Container District



Open containers of alcoholic beverages are allowed to be consumed outside in historic Downtown Bainbridge. Just follow a few rules and you're welcome to sip and stroll at your leisure in Downtown Bainbridge!

- Alcoholic drinks must in in a city-approved 16-ounce plastic cup. Drinking from a can, glass, or bottle is prohibited. There is a two drink on-street limit.
- You can not bring your own alcohol to Downtown Bainbridge. All alcoholic beverages consumed in the downtown historic area must be purchased from a licensed merchant in Downtown Bainbridge.
- No alcohol may be consumed in historic Downtown Bainbridge after midnight.
